School Nurse Notes: Mrs. Gabel

- 1. As students spend a good deal of time together in close contact, communicable diseases are more easily spread. Please report to the school should your child have a contagious condition such as strep throat, chicken pox, pink eye or the flu. Students whose temperature elevates to 100 degrees will be sent home and are to remain out of school until he/she has been fever free for 24 hours. Please do not give medication to reduce the fever and then send your child to school. The child is still contagious and will pass the illness to others.
- 2. Also, do not send your child to school if:
 - They have vomited within the last 24 hours.
 - They've had several episodes of diarrhea and stomach cramps in the past 24 hours.
 - One or both eyes are red with discharge.
 - They have a severe persistent cough as this is very exhaustive for the child.
 - They have breathing difficulties with a cold or the flu.

<u>Peanut/Tree Nut Aware Schools and Birthday Treats</u>

As a reminder, this year we will **NOT** be allowing Birthday Treats to be brought to school to celebrate your child' birthday in his/her classroom. We have several students that have severe food allergies and to prevent a reaction that would require emergency medical attention, we have decided to eliminate the birthday treats in the classroom. Students will receive a Birthday Pencil from the Office and a Birthday Cookie at lunch, provided by Nutrition Services.

Lincoln is a Peanut Aware/Tree Nut Aware school, so if your child brings a cold lunch to school, please be sure to double check that you do not send any items with peanuts/tree nuts in the food, this includes peanut butter. There are many substitutes for peanut butter at the grocery store, such as Sun Butter, WOW Butter, etc. If you send a Lunchable, please be sure that the candy bar that is in the Lunchable does not contain peanuts or peanut butter. If by accident, a student brings food with peanuts/tree nuts, they will be asked to not open it and place it back in their lunch bag. The food will be returned home with your child.

We will continue to have the Classroom Halloween and Valentine Parties. Classroom teachers will provide you with snack ideas and options for the parties. Thank you for understanding the change with the Birthday Treats. Our goal is to keep all our students safe while they are in our care.
